Carol Ramsey was initiated into DKG *Omega* Chapter on 1 June 1977. Her contributions to the Society for *Omega* Chapter and Pi State were many.

She served as Pi State President 1995-1997 and Chaired several Committees, including Pi State Leadership Development 2003-2005 and US Forum Representative. She was honored with the Pi State Achievement Award in 1999 and the DKG International Leadership Management Award in 1988. She received a Pi State Scholarship in 1989 and 2008. She received a Pi State Commendation for Exhibition of Innovative Programs in 1990.

Initiated in June 1977, Carol served as *Omega* President 1988-1990. She was the *Omega* First and Second Vice Presidents and chaired several Committees. She was a member of various Committees, including Scholarship and Historical Records/Research.

Carol's contributions to education were numerous. She was the Coordinator of Title One Instructional Services and received the LCC/NYSRA Service Award in 1991 and several NYSCE Exemplary Educators Awards and Service Awards from NYSRA, Lake Counties Reading Council and FLTRC. She was an Adjunct Mentor for the WFL Resource Center in 1989-1991. She worked for the Marion Central School District.

In 1988, she received a curriculum grant from WFL Teacher Resource Center, Service Award from Lakes Counties Reading Council, and was selected to the NYS Education Colloquium Council. In 1989, she was honored by NYS Dept. of Education with the NYS Exemplary Educator's Award for "Developing an Annual Review of Effectiveness Plan." In 1990, she received the Wayne-Finger Lakes First Place Super Teaching Ideas as an Adjunct Mentor for the Resource Center and a Commendation for Exhibition of Innovative Programs. She received the Literacy Volunteers of Wayne County Service Award in 2004 and the 2001 Volunteer Administrator of the Year. In 1991, she also received the New York State Reading Association Service Award and the NYS Association of Compensatory Education Exemplary Educator Award. In 1992 she received the Dedicated Service Award as the Building Representative for the Wayne-Finger Lakes Area Teachers' Resource Center. She also received a Dedicated Service Award as a member of the Policy Board. She was President of Wayne County Retired Teachers and on the Board and President of Literacy Volunteers of Wayne County.
